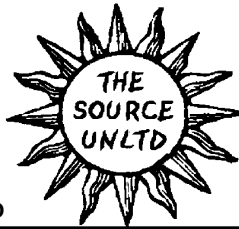

Day of the Dead by Dina Leor

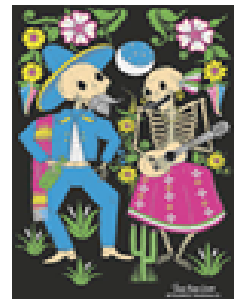
I went to Mexico when I was little and fell In love with the culture, people, traditions and food. The cultural roots run deep and are ancient. You see this everywhere you go, rich with traditions. In my heart it has always been my second home.

Dia de Los Muertos (Day of the Dead) is a Mexican holiday celebrating and honoring people who have passed away. The celebration occurs from October 31st through November 2nd (also in connection with the Catholic holiday of All Saints' Day which occurs on Nov. 1st and 2nd). Altars are built in the homes, decorated with photos, memories, food, drink, sugar skulls, things the person loved while being alive. Families go to the graves of loved ones to clean, bring flowers, food, music, candles. There are days for children who have passed and when they leave the adults come.

A common symbol of the holiday is the skull (called "calavera"), which celebrants represent in masks, called calacas (term for "skeleton"), and foods such as sugar or chocolate skulls, which are inscribed with the name of the recipient on the forehead. Sugar skulls are gifts that can be given to both the living and the dead. Other holiday foods include pan de muerto, a sweet egg bread made in various shapes, from plain rounds to skulls and rabbits, for celebrating this "fiesta" often decorated with white frosting to look like twisted bones.

BRUCE HORNSBY and the NOISEMAKERS -- LEVITATE  This disc opens up with a barrage of drum riffs and goes from there as Hornsby holds his latest lineup of musicians true to its name. Along with the familiar vocals and insightful lyrics, the music here is more aggressive than previous releases, with a couple of tunes venturing into Dead- like jam territory (he did tour with them for a spell). Standouts include "Prairie Dog Town" which advises: "Don't put your trust in a prairie dog, they'll rob your bank and steal your drawers" I do believe that's true. This one's a good listen. I give it 3 bones.
